The District Six Committee currently recognizes one Senior High School and one Junior High School for their leadership in promoting good sportsmanship, in the "Sportsmanship: The Only Missing Piece is You" program. This program will continue, however, the message and support for good sportsmanship will be delivered to every school this year as each member school will be asked to recognize one male senior athlete and one female senior athlete, for their leadership in the area of good sportsmanship. Names will be submitted to the Sportsmanship Committee and medals will be subsequently sent to the schools for a presentation during an end of year program of their choice. We solicit local media coverage and support as well. All schools are encouraged to submit names and photographs of their sportsmanship recipients to their local news media for recognition. Two male athletes and two female athletes will be randomly selected and awarded \$500.00 for their leadership and accomplishments.
